An attorney must be and remain a member in good standing of the court's bar and familiar with the court's CJA Plan, must demonstrate knowledge of and experience in federal criminal law and appellate procedure, and must be committed to indigent criminal defense. Applicants must be willing to accept appointments during the membership term.
