ORDER AND JUDGMENT*

Before MATHESON, BACHARACH, and PHILLIPS, Circuit Judges. **

This matter is before the court on the parties' *Joint Motion to Remand for Modification Proceedings*, in which they request that the court: (1) vacate the stock sexual material condition the district court imposed upon defendant-appellant Robert Ernest Peeples, Jr.'s conditions of supervised release; and (2) remand the case to the district court to conduct new modification proceedings with respect to any legally

Upon consideration and review of the record, the court:

- A. Grants the motion;
- B. Vacates the stock sexual material condition the district court imposed upon
 Mr. Peeples, Jr.'s conditions of supervised release;
- C. Remands this case to the district court to undertake, in its discretion, all necessary and appropriate modification proceedings related to any legally justifiable sexual material condition; and
- D. Directs the Clerk to issue the mandate forthwith.
